IMPORTANT DATES

Honey and Products of the Hive ENTRY AND RELEASE SCHEDULE

Online Entry Deadline:

By 10 pm, Tuesday, August 16

Deliver Entries:

Friday, August 19, Noon to 7 pm

Saturday, August 20, 10 am to 3 pm

Enter through red gate on 17th Street and follow signs to Columbia Hall.

Bring a copy of your online registration receipt (see instructions this page).

Pick up entries:

Tuesday, September 6, Noon to 7 pm

Wednesday, September 7, 10 am to 2 pm

By submitting an entry into the Fair, exhibitors agree to abide by all rules, regulations and entry requirements of the Fair and of the department(s) to which they are submitting entries.

It is important that exhibitors read and be familiar with the General Rules as well as the Department rules in this Handbook.

ONLINE REGISTRATION AND ENTRY INSTRUCTIONS

Read the complete rules, division descriptions and entry information in this Handbook **BEFORE** going to online Registration.

1. Then go to <http://oregon.fairmanager.com>
2. Click **Register** or **Sign In.** (for return visits).
 - Register using your First and Last Name and create a password (write password down).
 - Fill in requested information, including email address. Add age only if under 18. Click **Continue.**
 - Select **Department** ex.: Honey and Products...
 - Select a **Division** ex.: Division 242 - Beeswax
 - Select a **Class** ex.: Class 2421 Beeswax Block
 - Fill in all information for class(es) you are entering, including a brief **Description** if needed.
3. When all your information is complete, click **Add Entry to Cart** and follow instructions to check out. (NOTE: If you think you may want to modify your entries, you may save your current session and check out at a later session. Be sure to **Check Out before the closing date listed for your classes; entries are not submitted to the Fair office until the check out process is complete.**)
4. Fill in "yes" at the statement to agree to all the terms and conditions of entry as defined in this Handbook.
5. Click **Submit.**
6. Please print and bring a copy of your detailed online entry receipt **with your entries** when you bring them to the Fair.

GENERAL RULES



1. Oregon State Fair (OSF) competitions are open to residents of Oregon only. Entries do not need to be entered or have won at a county fair to be eligible for any competition.
2. All articles must be the handiwork of the exhibitor and not been previously exhibited in a prior year at the Oregon State Fair, unless otherwise noted in Department rules.
3. Online entries must be submitted by the date indicated within each Department Handbook. Paper applications will not be accepted. Information must be accurate and complete. Walk-in entries may be accepted during intake days on a limited basis.
4. Entries must be delivered and removed only during the scheduled times. Any exception shall be at the discretion of OSF staff.
5. Entries will receive a claim check upon delivery. Exhibitor must present claim check or valid Oregon ID when picking up entries.
6. Some competitions require an entry fee. See specific departments for fee and processing information.
7. OSF staff or a judge may disqualify or transfer any exhibit which is not a true representation of the class in which it is entered or if rules are not followed.
8. Judging is closed to the public unless otherwise noted. Every reasonable effort is made to secure highly qualified judges with expertise in their field.
9. Entries by OSF staff, volunteers or judges are prohibited in the department in which they are working. They may enter other departments.
10. Ribbons and/or prizes will be awarded as warranted. All judges' results are final. Results cannot be provided over the phone but will be posted online when available. (www.oregonstatefair.org)
11. Protests may be submitted to the Creative Living office accompanied by a deposit of \$25 which will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. Protests must plainly state the cause of the complaint or appeal and submitted within 24 hours of the action.
12. Ribbons and scorecards (as available) are provided with return of entries after Fair. See specific departments for return days.
13. OSF is authorized to use any and all photographs, video and or digital images related to the entry for promotional purposes.
14. Exhibitors shall indemnify OSF from and against all claims for damage to persons or property caused by them or their exhibits.
15. OSF will take reasonable precautions to ensure safety of exhibits while on the fairgrounds, but will not be responsible for loss, damage, theft or injury of any kind to exhibits or exhibitors, unless the loss or damage is due to the negligence of OSF staff and volunteers.
16. Exhibitors found in violation of rules, or to be in practices unethical or adverse to OSF, shall be penalized by forfeiture of awards and/or privileges, and removed from the exhibit.
17. Items not picked up by final return days of each department are forfeited by exhibitor.

The Oregon State Fair reserves the final and absolute right to interpret any and all terms, conditions, rules and regulations contained in any and all parts of Department Handbooks and to settle and determine all matters, questions or differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of, connected with or incidental to the Oregon State Fair. OSF further reserves the right to determine unforeseen matters not covered by General or Competition Rules, and to withdraw award offerings in all Competitions should any emergency exist and circumstances demand. In the event of discrepancies between General and Department Rules, Department Rules will supersede General Rules.



DEPARTMENT RULES



1. All General Rules Apply. Your submission indicates you have read and agree to abide by the General Rules and the Rules of this Competition.
2. All exhibits must have been produced under the direct management of the Exhibitor and produced from the apiary of the Exhibitor between September, 2015 and August 2016.
3. Honey must be purely produced by bees with no additives and be true to the entry category.
4. Junior exhibitors (17 and under) are encouraged, and will be judged against other junior entries.
5. Exhibitors are limited to one entry per class and a maximum of 10 entries per person.
6. Entries will be judged according to The Oregon State Beekeepers Association Standards or Welsh Honey Judging methods.
7. Decision of Judges is final.
8. 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place ribbons will be awarded according to merit. The judges reserve the right to not award ribbons if standards are not met. Rosette ribbon(s) for Best of Division or Show may be awarded.
9. Entries must be submitted and picked up according to entry schedule. Fair is not responsible for any entries not picked up by 2:00 pm, Wednesday, September 7, 2016.

JUDGES

Dr. Dewey Caron- Senior Honey Judge

Dewey M. Caron is a graduate of Cornell University and Emeritus Professor from the University of Delaware. He has received numerous awards and forms of recognition for his teaching and extension work during his career. Dr. Caron also has an Affiliate Professorship, courtesy of an appointment at Oregon State University. Dewey has served as the Vice-President of The Oregon State Beekeepers Association.

Trevor Riches- Steward

Trevor Riches is a Mentor with the Oregon Master Beekeepers Program and a Certified Judge in the Welsh Honey Judge Certification Program, run jointly by the University of Florida and University of Georgia in concert with the Welsh Beekeepers Association.





DIVISIONS & CLASSES



There are two levels for Honey Entries: Youth (17 years of age and younger) and Adult (Oregon Beekeeper).
Division 240 is designated for Youth, but Youth may choose to enter any other division, competing against adults.

240 – Youth (Ages 17 years and younger)

- 2401 Artistic Beeswax, molded or dipped (1 lb min)*
- 2402 Beeswax, any other
- 2403 Honey, Extracted (any variety)

241 - Beekeeping Photo

Entries must be an 8"x10" mounted photograph in a black frame

- 2411 Fair theme (Here Comes the Fun)
- 2412 Bees and their Keepers
- 2413 Bees/Bee Colonies at work

242 - Beeswax

Minimum quantities are listed below

- 2421 Artistic Beeswax, molded or dipped (1 lb min)*
- 2422 Beeswax Block – 1 block (1 lb min)
- 2423 Beeswax Candles, dipped – 2 dipped candles, 100% beeswax
- 2424 Beeswax Candles, molded- 2 molded candles, 100% beeswax

*Artistic Beeswax can be several shades of beeswax, i.e., brood or capping wax.
Artificial enhancements accepted but should not overpower the beeswax.

243 - Honey, Extracted (any variety)

Extracted Honey – 3 one pound, uniformly filled, Queenline or otherwise
one pound or one pint glass/plastic jar

- 2431 Light
- 2432 Amber
- 2433 Dark

244 - Honey, Other (any variety)

- 2441 Chunk Honey Jar – 3 one pint or one pound jars
- 2442 Comb Honey section – 3 square or round sections comb honey
- 2443 Creamed – 3 one pint or one pound jars
- 2444 Cut Comb – 3 uniformly cut comb pieces (min 12 oz each)
- 2445 Extracting Frame with Capped Honey Comb – one frame (any size)

ARTISTIC BEESWAX

Points	Item
35	Creativity & appearance
30	Clean lines – no impurities
20	Variety in colors
15	Stability of design

BEESWAX BLOCK & BEESWAX CANDLES - One piece

Points	Item
35	Cleanliness (down-grade for impurities)
30	Color, odor & brightness – straw, canary, shades of yellow
20	Uniformity of appearance
15	Freedom from cracks or blemishes

EXTRACTED HONEY

Points	Item
30	Cleanliness, freedom of foam & dirt
20	Variety flavor, down-grade for objectionable flavor, over-heating or fermentation
20	Degree of density -DQ above 18.6%
10	Freedom of crystals – clarity
10	Neatness & clean condition of bottles
10	Uniformity of filling exhibit (labels if labeled)

CHUNK HONEY

Points	Item
30	Uniformity of appearance & capping's color & thickness of comb
20	Neatness of cut, size uniformity
20	Absence of watery capping's, uncapped & Pollen cells
20	Cleanliness, travel stain, foreign matter flakes of wax, foam, debris
10	Density & flavor of honey

COMB HONEY & CUT COMB HONEY

Points	Item
35	Uniformity of color & appearance
20	Absence of uncapped cells & watery capping's (Cut comb cut neatness)
20	Cleanliness of section or frame
15	Uniformity of weight (except frame)
10	Lack of granulation & pollen

CREAMED HONEY

Points	Item
35	Fineness of crystals
25	Uniformity & firmness
25	Cleanliness & lack of foam
15	Flavor, down-grade for off flavor, over heating
